CLINICAL INTERESTS

Director of California Sinus Centers:

The Sinus Center was founded at Stanford in 1999 by Dr. Vaughan. This was the first center on the West Coast to offer comprehensive medical and surgical care for Chronic Sinusitis by a fellowship-trained Otolaryngologist. Dr. Vaughan was also the first to train fellows in this field on the West Coast. California Sinus Centers and Sinus Care Foundation were formed to further our clinical, research and educational goals.

RESEARCH INTERESTS

Frontal Sinus Surgery

Frontal Sinus Surgery can be the most challenging aspect of endoscopic procedures. We have served as a referral center for cases involving difficult sinus surgery, especially cases with frontal problems for the last 10 years.

Orbital Decompression, TED and Grave's Orbital Disease

Thyroid eye disease (TED) is an autoimmune condition that often occurs in people who develop an overactive thyroid gland. TED causes the fat and muscles behind the eye to enlarge. Symptoms include redness, irritation and pressure behind the eyes. This can push the eye forward and restrict its movement, resulting in the inability to fully close the eyelids. In some cases, protruding or misaligned eyes and double vision can occur. Doctors at Calsinus work closely with Dr. Kim Cockerham in the surgical management in patients who have failed other means of alleviating their symptoms. Balloon Sinuplasty $^{\text{TM}}$ - catheter based sinus ostial dilation

Dr. Vaughan performed the first live balloon sinuplasty in the USA in 2005. Dr. Vaughan has been involved with the approaches / devices used for sinus dilation. He has been involved in many of the USA-based studies of Sinuplasty. He also served as a consultant for Acclarent Inc. which developed this technology.

Emerging trends in Sinus Surgery

California Sinus is based in the heart of Silicon Valley, next to Stanford University and the San Francisco Bay Area.

This region is the leading areas for Biotechnology in the World! - and several companies are actively involved in the development of treatment options for sinus patients. We are often asked to review, help develop and research devices/ tools with companies based in this region.

Nebulized medications in the treatment of sinus diseases:

Dr. Vaughan worked on the development, use and research into nebulized medications for the management of difficult chronic sinus cases since 2000. See publication below. This work has led to new treatment options being available nationwide for these patients. Dr. Vaughan served as the Director of the scientific advisory board of Sinus Pharmacy. He also consulted for a separate research company, Sinus Pharma Inc. This company performed a multicenter study on the use of neulized Tobi for sinus patients.

Effect of Carbon Dioxide levels on blood loss during Endoscopic Sinus Surgery

The level of Carbon Dioxide (CO2) in blood can be regulated during anesthesia. Regulation of this level may decrease blood loss. Joint studies with the Stanford

Anesthesia Dept. have been done. Sinus surgical patients were offered enrollment in this study. Co-investigator: Vladimir Nekandzy, MD, Dept. of Aesthesia.

Use of Alternative Therapies in sinus management

There are publications which suggest that a significant number of chronic sinus patients use alternative therapies to treat their sinuses. These include herbs, acupuncture, biofeedback etc. Studies have been completed. This revealed that standard therapies (both medical and surgical) continue to 'out-perform' against alternative therapies, but patients have a very high acceptance rate for alternative treatments.

Emergence of increasing Drug Resistance in chronic sinusitis

Chronic sinusitis patients have frequent infections. There are several studies which demonstrate increased antibiotic resistance and the emergence of gram negative and fungal species. We are studying whether there are approaches which can decrease the use of empiric antibiotics in chronic sinus patients.

Several studies continue at Cal Sinus in this area. These include:

- 1. Use of culture-directed therapy for acute infections in chronic sinus patients.
- 2. Limited use of post-operative antibiotics after sinus surgery.
- 3. Serial Microbiology data of infections in chronic sinus patients.

Use of anti-fungals in the management of allergic fungal sinusitis

Allergic Fungal Sinusitis can lead to extensive and recurrent sinus disease. Use of nebulized antifungals, antifungal nasal rinses and oral antifungals are recommended. Side effects, failure rates and outcome data of these different approaches are monitored.

Psychological impact of chronic sinusitis on patients

All chronic diseases can lead to significant impact on the quality of life and psychological functioning of patients. Quality of life outcome surveys are conducted on all sinus patients at Cal Sinus. Retrospective studies (via outcome surveys) on the impact of several therapies include:

- 1. Impact of endoscopic and culture-directed therapy,
- 2. Impact of revision endoscopic sinus surgery with surgical navigation and
- 3. Impact of recurrent disease and surgery on psychological outcome measures.

Instrumentation and Computer Navigation for Endoscopic Sinus Surgery

Dr. Vaughan has consulted with several companies to develop better software and hardware for the treatment of sinus disease. This has included several software changes

used nationwide for surgical navigation. He has also designed the first set of advanced endoscopic instruments for sphenoidotomy and surrounding procedures.

Research continues in this area, with outcome studies looking at the avoidance of external, revision and destructive surgical approaches. Our published papers have demonstrated excellent frontal sinus outcomes and avoidance of external surgeries.
